PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISEDC), is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

This device is complied with SAR for general population / uncontrolled exposure limits in ANSI/IEEE C95.1-1992 and had been tested in accordance with the measurement methods and procedures specified in IEEE1528.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested is 0.65 W/Kg for use at the ear and 1.38 W/Kg for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure.





1.1 Keys and connectors

- 1 Installing or removing the back cover.
- Charging the battery.
- 3 Inserting or removing the SIM card.
- 4 Inserting or removing the microSD card.



 Touch to switch between individual app activities and documents.

Home button

- From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Long press to turn on Google Now. You can get help such as getting directions and restaurant information based on the content detected on the screen.

✓ Back button

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or close a dialog box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/Restart/Aeroplane mode.
- Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key to take a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.

Volume keys

- In call mode, adjusts the call volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ringtone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In camera preview mode, press Volume up or down key to take a photo or press and hold to take a burst shot.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Setting up

Inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card as this phone supports hot swap.



Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini and micro cards; otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery (). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, PIN, Password or Pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network operator. Be sure to keep your PIN code safe.

1.2.3 Powering off your phone

Press and hold the **Power** key until options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** button to switch to the Home screen.



- Status bar
 - Status/Notification indicators

- Touch and drag down to open the Notification panel.
- 4 Google Search bar
 - Touch 1 to enter text search screen
 - Touch 2 to enter voice search screen
- 5 Swipe left or right to view more screens
- 6 Favorite tray applications
 - Enter the application.
 - Long press to move or remove applications.
- 7 Enter the Main Menu.

Reversible screen

The phone supports the reversible function. From the Home screen, touch (11) to open the App drawer, then touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen, touch the icon

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch &



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Long press



To enter the available options for an item, long press the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, long press this contact, an option list will appear.



Long press an item and drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.



Similar to swiping, flicking is a lighter and quicker stroke.

Pinch/Spread



Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

The phone also supports one finger zooming in Camera and Gallery. Double touch the screen to zoom in/out.

Rotate



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better screen view.

1.3.2 Status bar

From the Status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the Quick settings panel.

Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you can touch them to access notifications.

Notification panel

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.



- 1 Open the Quick Settings panel
- 2 Touch and drag down to open the Notification panel.
- 3 Clear all notifications (ongoing notifications will remain)

Quick Settings panel

Touch and drag down the notification panel to open the Quick Settings panel. You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.

1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.

Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch
 on the keyboard if you want to search the web.

2 Search by voice

- Touch \$\bigset\$ from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Locking and unlocking your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone with a pattern, PIN or password, etc.

To create a screen unlock pattern

- From the Home screen, touch (1) to open the App drawer, then touch Settings > Lock settings > Screen lock.
- Draw your own pattern.

To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock the phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, slide to draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password, etc.

If you have chosen **Swipe** as the screen lock, you can press the **Power** key to light up the screen, then swipe up to unlock the screen.



Double tap to enter the detailed screen

1.3.5 Personalising your Home screen

Add

You can long press a folder, an application or a widget and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

Reposition

Long press an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Long press an item and drag it up to the top of the **Remove** icon, then release.

Create folders

To improve the organisation of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Long press an empty area on the Home screen, then touch **WALLPAPERS** to customise wallpaper.

1.3.6 Widgets and recently used applications

Consult widgets

Long press the empty area on the Home screen, then touch **WIDGETS** to display all widgets.

Touch the selected widget and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

Consult recently used applications

To consult recently used applications, touch the **Recent Apps** button. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it right/left or touch ${\bf X}$ to close an application.

Touch at the bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.

1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using the volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates.

Using the settings menu

From the Home screen, touch (iii) to open the App drawer, then touch **Settings** > **Sound** to set the volume for media, ringtones, alarms, etc.

2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard

Onscreen keyboard settings

Go to **Settings** > **Languages & input**, touch the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust it by changing the settings (Touch Settings > Display > Autorotate screen).



3.1.1 Making a call

To make a call, touch ...



- Call log
- 2 Contacts
- 3 Call the previewed number.
- Show the dial pad

5 View the contact's detailed information. You can also edit, delete, share the contact, or send a message to the contact.



Enter the desired number from the dial pad and touch to place the call or select a contact from **CONTACTS** or **CALL LOG** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch to make the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching the **Create new contact** icon or the **Add to** a **contact** icon.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching \times .

To hang up a call, touch .

International call

To dial an international call, long press 0 to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and touch .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call





When you receive a call, a call window will be presented on top of the screen. Touch **DISMISS** to dismiss a call or **ANSWER** to answer a call. Touch the call window to open the Phone call screen. On the Phone call screen:

- Touch (to answer the call;
- Touch 🗖 to reject the call;
- Double tap
 to reject the call by sending a preset message.
- Touch to set a call back reminder.

To mute an incoming call, press the **Volume** key or turn the phone over (when the **Settings > Gestures > Turn over to mute** option is activated).

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, long press 1.

If you receive a voicemail, **ao** appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New voicemail**.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume** key.



- End the current call.
- Touch once to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Touch once to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- Display the dial pad.
- Touch once to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.
- t Touch to add another call.
- Touch to open Contacts and Record call options.



To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the phone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the phone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the contact name or number to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch \tag{t} to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch . You can also add participants from **Call log** or **Contacts**.
- Touch 1 to start the conference.
- (1) Depending on your network operator.

• Touch • to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

Touch from the Call screen, then touch Settings to set Phone settings and Contact settings, such as Quick responses, Call blocking, Call forwarding/barring, ect.

3.2 Call log

You can access your call log by touching ① from the **Call** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations, you can launch a new call, send a message to the contact or number, view detailed information of the call, or clear the call.

Touch • to access **Call history**, and touch • to clear all call history.

3.3 Contacts.....



Contacts enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise them with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 Consult your Contacts

To see your contacts, touch 2 from the App drawer.



- 1 Display the contacts list option menu
- 2 View your favorites
- 3 Open the Quick contact panel Long press to select contact(s) to delete
- 4 Add new contact



Deleted contacts will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.3.2 Adding a contact

Touch (a) in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.



- 1 When finished, touch this icon to save
- 2 Touch to open available labels
- Select a picture or take a photo for the contact

Add to/Remove from Favourites (1)

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch \bigstar to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch the star \bigstar on the contact details screen.

3.3.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch
in the contact details screen.

When finished, touch

to save.

3.3.4 Use Quick contact for Android

⁽¹⁾ Only phone contacts and account contacts can be added to Favourites.



The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

3.3.5 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

This phone enables you to import or export contacts between your phone, SIM card and phone storage.

From the Contacts screen, touch to open the options menu. Touch Import/Export, then select to import/export contacts from/to your accounts, SIM card, Phone, internal storage, micro SD card, etc.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch the contact you want to share, touch • and Share from the contact details screen. Select the number you want to share, touch , and then select the application to perform this action.

3.3.6 Displaying contacts

You can configure which list of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch and touch **Contacts to display** from contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

Touch and then Settings > Display options to sort the list by touching First name or Last name, as well as viewing contact names by touching First name first or Last name first.

3.3.7 Merging/Separating contacts (1)

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch \nearrow to enter the edit contact screen, then touch again and touch **Link**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to merge with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch to enter the edit contact screen, then touch again and touch **Unlink**. Touch **OK** to confirm.

3.3.8 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch from the contacts list and touch Settings > Manage accounts, or from the Home screen, touch from then Settings > Accounts > Add account.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Touch the account you want to delete > Touch • > Select **Remove account** > Confirm.

Auto-sync

On the **Accounts** screen, touch • and mark the **Autosync data** checkbox. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronised with each other.

4 Messaging and Email

4.1 Messaging.....



You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

4.1.1 Write a new message

On the message list screen, touch • to write text/multimedia messages.

- 2 Send the text message

3 Insert emojis

Sending a text message

To add recipients, enter the name or phone number of the recipient in the **To** bar. Touch the **Type an SMS message** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch to send the text message.

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. There is a counter on the right of the text box to remind you how many characters are allowed to be entered in one message.



Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles and email addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **To** bar. Touch the **Type message** bar to enter the text of the message.

Touch to open the options menu. Touch Add subject to insert a subject. Touch to attach a picture, video, audio or contact.

When finished, touch to send the multimedia message.

4.1.2 Manage messages

When receiving a message, will appear on the Status bar as a notification. Drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:

- Touch _ to call the number;
- Touch to save the number to contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved;
- To reply to a message, enter the text or touch to insert quick text, contact, etc. When finished, touch
- If you long press a message, the following options will be available: delete m,mute m, add contact + s, select all w, other options menu s, etc.

4.1.3 Adjust message settings

On the message list screen, touch \equiv and select **Settings**.

GENERAL

Storage, Notifications, WAP push messages, Cell Broadcast settings, Cell Broadcast Notifications, etc. can be set in General settings.

ADVANCED

Text message (SMS) settings and Multimedia message (MMS) settings can be set in Advanced settings.

4.2 Email



The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing email address or to create a new email account.

You can also set up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your phone.

To set up your email account, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email setup wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address of the account you want to set up.
- Touch NEXT. If the account you entered is not provided by a recognised service provider, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. You can also touch MANUAL SETUP to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- Enter your password.
- Finish by setting up your account settings for synchronising frequency, notifications, etc.
- Edit your account name if necessary.

To add another email account, you can touch the \equiv icon, select **Settings**, and touch **Add account**.

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon from the inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the **To** field.
- If necessary, touch the Add Cc/Bcc menu icon \checkmark to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch @ to add an attachment.
- Touch ➤ to send.
- If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch the icon and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch the \equiv icon from the inbox screen and then touch **Settings**, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.


5 Calendar, Clock, and Calculator.....

You can use **Calendar** to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, touch (III) from the Home screen, then touch Calendar.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day, 3-day, Week, or Month.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch 🖜
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All-day**.
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses
 of the guests you want to invite with commas to
 separate. The guests will receive an invitation from
 Calendar and Fmail.
- When finished, touch SAVE from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Week view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn \blacksquare , then touch the icon to create the new event.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen. Touch
to edit the event, or touch
and then **Delete** to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel and touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch the **Back** button to keep the reminders pending in the Status bar and the Notification panel.



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch Clock.

5.2.1 World clock

Touch (a) to add a time zone.

5.2.2 Alarm

From the Time screen, touch 👸 to enter the Alarm screen.

Turn on ____ to enable the alarm.

Touch • to add a new alarm:

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.

Touch \vee and then $\stackrel{\blacksquare}{=}$ to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.3 Countdown

From the Time screen, touch **T** to enter the **Countdown** screen.

- Enter the time. The time should be typed in second, minute and hour number sequence.
- Touch **t**o start the countdown.
- Touch ** to set the countdown time in panel.
- Touch **n** to pause the countdown.
- Touch into delete current countdown label.

5.2.4 Timer

From the Time screen, touch on to enter the Timer screen.

- Touch **()** to start the timer.
- Touch () to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Touch **u** to halt the total and lap times. These will only restart after is touched.
- Touch To delete the record.
- Touch < to share.

5.2.5 Adjust Clock settings

Touch and then **Settings** to access **Clock** and **Alarms** settings.

5.3 Calculator



To use the calculator, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch Calculator.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two wavs:

- Swipe the basic calculation screen to the left to open the scientific calculation.
- Turn the phone to the landscape orientation from the basic panel to open the scientific calculation. This option is only available if Settings > Display > When device is rotated > Rotate the contents of the screen is on.



Touch X to delete digits one by one, or long press X to delete all at once.



6 Getting connected...

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

6.1 Connecting to the internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: GPRS, EDGE, 3G or 4G.

If the network is not connected, you can turn on mobile data in **Settings** > **Data usage**.

To check the network connection you are using, touch Settings > More > Mobile networks > Access Point Names or Network operators.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch Settings > More > Mobile networks > Access Point Names
- Touch to select **More option** > **New APN** to enter the required APN information.

• When finished, touch • and then Save.

To enable data roaming

- Touch Settings > More > Mobile networks.
- Touch **Data roaming** and choose Roaming modes: **Disable**, **National roaming only**, **All networks**.
- When data roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

To set preferred network mode

 Touch Settings > More > Mobile networks > Preferred network type.

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Turn on _____.
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.

 Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch CONNECT.

To enable notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the Status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch **Settings** > **Wi-Fi**.
- Touch 🏩.
- Turn on **Network notification ...**

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Touch Add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch SAVE.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.

6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device (1)

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Turn on Bluetooth _____.

Your device name and other available devices will appear on screen.

⁽¹⁾ You are recommended to use alcatel Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to www.alcatel-mobile.com for more information about the alcatel Bluetooth headset.

To rename your device

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Touch and Rename this device.
- Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Touch and Refresh.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your phone with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will be connected to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch to unpair.
- Touch **FORGET** to confirm.

6.3 Connecting to a computer via USB

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and a computer.

To connect your phone to the computer

Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

Open the Notification panel and touch **USB** for file **transfer**, then, in the next dialogue, choose the way in which you want to transfer files. By default, **Transfer** files (MTP) is selected.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

6.4 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to five devices at once via Bluetooth (Bluetooth tethering) or Wi-Fi (mobile hotspot).



The functions below may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB and Bluetooth, or as a mobile hotspot

Go to **Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot** to activate these functions.

To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When mobile hotspot is activated, you can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Touch Settings > More > Tethering & mobile hotspot > Mobile hotspot.
- Touch Set up mobile hotspot to rename the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch SAVE.

6.5 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch **Settings** > **More** > **VPN** and then touch +.
- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to/from VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch Settings > More > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch CONNECT.

To disconnect from a VPN:

• Touch the VPN you want to disconnect from. In the dialog that opens, touch **DISCONNECT**.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

• Touch Settings > More > VPN.

- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the ticon next to the VPN you want to edit.
- After editing, touch **SAVE**.

To delete a VPN:

• Touch the to the selected VPN, then touch FORGET to delete it.

7 Multimedia applications.......


7.1 Camera.....



Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and videos.

Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To take a photo or video, touch (III) from the Home screen and then touch Camera.

Flash mode

Touch to turn on/off the camera flash.

- 2 Slide left or right to change the camera mode to Pano, Photo, Video, etc.
- 3 Switch between front/back camera
- 4 Open settings
- **5** Touch the screen to focus
- 6 Pinch/spread two fingers together/apart to zoom out/in
- 7 View the photos or videos you have taken
- 8 Take a photo
- Filter button

Touch to preview the viewfinder with live filter applied. Touch any filter to apply filter and return to the previous screen.

To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary and touch to capture. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also long press to take burst shots.

To take a video

Slide left to change the camera mode to video, then touch to start video recording. You can also touch to take a picture during video recording.

Touch to pause video recording and touch to continue. Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch <, then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch \leftarrow to return to Camera.

7.1.1 Modes and settings

Swipe horizontally or touch on the mode name to switch between modes.

PANO

Touch to turn on panorama function. Touch the shutter button to start taking panoramic photo and move the phone steadily along the direction indicated by the onscreen line. Once the slots are filled, the photo will be automatically saved. If the slots are not fully filled, touch the shutter button again to save the photo.

PHOTO

Photo is the default mode for Camera.

VIDEO

Record a video with Camera.

TIME-LAPSE

Capture a series of photos and convert them into a sped up time-lapse video.

INSTANT COLLAGE

Instant collage allows the user to instantly create a collage using a selection of predefined layouts.

Settings

Grid

Turn on to enable grid view. It divides the screen into equal parts and helps you take better photos by making it simple to align elements, such as the horizon or buildings, to the lines in the grid.

Face Beauty

Face Beauty allows the user to apply a skin filter to their face. The beauty icon only shows in front camera mode and when the Face Beauty setting is enabled (enable by default). The default filter value is 50%.



filter value.

Video stabilisation (EIS)

Turn on to enable the Electronic Image Stabilization (EIS) feature. It helps reduce blurring associated with the motion of a camera during exposure.


Save location information

Turn on **t**o tag photos and videos with your location. This option is available when the GPS location service is enabled.



Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and play videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To view the photos you have taken, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch Gallery.



To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in the Gallery.



All your selfie pictures will be stored in a separate album Selfies.

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Find the picture you want to work on, and touch the picture in the full-screen picture view. Touch < to share the picture, or

to edit the picture. Touch and select Set as... to set the picture as Contact photo or Wallpaper.

- 🔁 Set effects such as Punch, Vintage, B/W, Bleach, etc.
- Add a border.
- Crop, Straighten, Rotate, Mirror or Draw the picture.
- Adjust the picture colour.

Batch operation

The Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

On **Moments** screen , touch : and touch **Select items** to activate batch operation mode (you can also long press one album/picture), then touch videos/pictures you want to work with. Touch : to delete selected files. Touch < to share selected files.

7.3 Music.....



You can play music files stored on your phone or microSD card. Music files can be downloaded from your computer to the phone using a USB cable.

To play a music file, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch **Music**.

7.3.1 Playing music

Touch a song to play.



- Search for a song.
- 2 Change the song display.
- 3 Access more functions.
- Play or pause.

- 6 Play the next song.
- 6 Access the menu.
- While playing songs with Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

3 Others.....

8.1 Files.....



To manage the files in your phone, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch **Files**.

Files works with both external SD card and internal storage.

Files displays all data stored on the phone, including applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to phone, you can locate the application using Files, then touch it to install it in your phone.

Files allows you to perform the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

8.2 Sound Recorder.....



To record voice, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch Sound Recorder.

Sound Recorder allows you to record voice/sound.

8.3 Radio.....



Your phone is equipped with a radio ⁽¹⁾ with RDS ⁽²⁾ functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with visual information related to the radio program displayed if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To listen to a radio programme, touch (11) from the Home screen, then touch Radio.

- 1 Touch to open and view the saved channels list.
- 2 Touch to add the current station to favorites.
- 3 Drag to change current frequency.
- 4 Touch to increase 0.1MHz. Long press to search and go to the nearest higher frequency channel.
- **5** Touch to go to next saved channel.
- 6 Touch to enable/disable the loudspeaker.
- 7 Touch to decrease 0.1MHz. Long press to search and go to the nearest lower frequency channel.
- **8** Touch to go to previous saved channel.
- Touch to play/stop.

The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

⁽²⁾ Depending on your network operator and market.



To listen to the radio you must insert headphones. Headphones act as radio antenna.

Available options:

• Save channel

Save the current station to the channel list.

Scan channels

Touch to search for channels.

Delete

Delete the channel.

Enter frequency

Enter the frequency manually to turn to the channel.

Station info

Mark the checkbox to display station information.

Exit

Turn off the radio.

8.4 Other applications (1).....

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, refer to the leaflet provided with the phone. To download and install more 3rd party applications, use the Google Play Store application.

Google applications

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

9.1 Chrome

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronised with your Google account.

9.2 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application, you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account.

9.3 Maps

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can get your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

9.4 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

9.5 Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

9.6 Drive

A file storage and synchronisation service created by Google, which allows users to store files in the cloud, share and edit files.

Files in Drive are kept secure and can be accessed from any device by logging in to your Google account. Files or folders can be shared privately with other Google account users.

9.7 Play Music

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for internet-connected devices, the Google Play Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through Play Music are automatically added to the user's account.

9.8 Duo

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

9.9 Photos

Google Photos stores and backs up your photos and videos. It also automatically analyses photos and organises them into groups, so that you can quickly find the photos you need.

9.10 Keep

A note taking application developed by Google.

You can insert images, lists, and record voice in your notes. You can also set time or location-based reminders for notes. Google Keep allows you to categorise notes by labels, and notes are searchable based on their colour, whether they have reminders, audio, images, or lists.

10 Settings.....



To go to Settings, touch m from the Home screen, then touch **Settings**.

10.1 Wireless & networks

10.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can access the internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

10.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, refer to "6.2 Connecting to a Bluetooth device".

10.1.3 Data usage

Mobile data

If you do not need to transmit data on mobile networks, turn off **Mobile data** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local operator mobile networks, particularly if you do not have a mobile data agreement.

Set data limit

By enabling **Set data limit**, your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and applications related to the data use of your phone.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your operator may count differently.

10.1.4 More > Aeroplane mode

Turn on Aeroplane mode to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

10.1.5 More > Tethering & mobile hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (refer to "6.4 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection").

10.1.6 More > VPN

For more information on VPN, refer to "6.5 Connecting to virtual private networks".

10.1.7 More > Mobile networks

You can set Data roaming, Preferred networks, Preferred network type, Access Point Names, and Network operators in this menu.

10.2 Device

10.2.1 Home screen

Touch to set the Home screen style to **Basic Home** screen.

10.2.2 Gestures

Touch to set gestures for incoming calls, alarms and screen.

10.2.3 Fingerprint

Touch the fingerprint sensor to unlock your phone, visit private content, or sign in to apps.

10.2.4 Lock settings

Func shortcuts

Touch to customise the application shortcuts displayed on your lock screen.

WallShuffle

If this function is enabled, different wallpapers will be displayed on your lock screen each time you press the power key to unlock your phone.

Screen lock

Touch to set your screen unlock method. For example, you can unlock your phone by sliding the screen, entering a password, or drawing a pattern, etc.

Smart lock

With **Smart lock**, you can set your trusted devices, places, face, voice, etc. To enable this function you must first set a screen lock.

10.2.5 Display

In this menu, you can adjust your screen brightness, wallpaper, sleep time, font size, etc.

To rotate screen contents when device is rotated, touch to select **Auto-rotate screen**.

10.2.6 Notifications

Touch to allow, block, or set priority for app notifications.

10.2.7 Sound

Touch to adjust call and notification ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

10.2.8 Apps

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the **Permissions** menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your **Camera, Contacts, Location**, etc.

In the **Notifications** menu, you can configure whether to block the notifications from this app, hide sensitive content, etc.

10.2.9 Storage

Touch to monitor device storage and available space.

10.2.10 Battery

Touch any category in the battery management screen to view its power consumption.

10.2.11 Memory

Touch to view the total memory and the memory used by applications.

10.3 Personal

10.3.1 Location

On

Turn on to enable the use of information from Wi-Fi and mobile networks to determine your approximate location, for use in Google Maps, when you search, and so on. When you select this option, you're asked whether you consent to share your location anonymously with Google's location service.

Mode

Touch to select **High accuracy, Battery saving** or **Device only** mode.

Recent location requests

This list shows the recent location requests.

Location services

This list shows location services from Google.

10.3.2 Security

Touch to set Encryption, SIM card lock, Device administration, Credential storage, etc.

10.3.3 Accounts

Touch to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronise data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronise user data automatically.

Add account

Touch **Add account** to add an account for the selected app.

10.3.4 Google

Touch to configure your Google account and services settings.

10.3.5 Languages & input

Touch to configure language settings, the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc.

10.3.6 Backup & reset

Back up my data

Turn on to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone when you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure in the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

Backup account

Touch to set your backup account.

Automatic restore

Turn on to restore your backed-up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

DRM reset

This operation will delete all the licences on your device.

Network settings reset

Touch to reset all network settings.

Factory data reset

Erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded.

If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

10.4 System

10.4.1 Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customise your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

10.4.2 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

10.4.3 Printing

Your phone supports wireless printing to enabled printers and online services.

10.4.4 Regulatory & safety

Touch to view product information.

10.4.5 Scheduled power on & off

Turn on the switches to enable scheduled power on/off, and preset your power on/off time and repeat mode.

10.4.6 About phone

This contains information such as Legal information, Model number, Android version, Android security patch level, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number, and Custom build version.

11 Making the most of your phone

11.1 Updates

Use the **Updates** app to update your device software. To access **Updates**, touch on the Home screen and select Updates. Alternatively, go to **Settings > About phone > System updates**.

Touch and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, touch the button, and when that's finished, touch to complete the update. Now your phone will have the latest version of the software. Turn on data connection or Wi-Fi before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check frequency are also available once you restart the phone. If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, a dialog will pop up where you can choose to download the update or ignore. A notification will also appear in the Status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

13 Warranty

Your phone is warranted against any defect or malfunctioning which may occur in conditions of normal use during the warranty period of twelve (12) months ⁽¹⁾ from the date of purchase as shown on your original invoice.

Batteries ⁽²⁾ and accessories sold with your phone are also warranted against any defect which may occur during the first six (6) months ⁽¹⁾ from the date of purchase as shown on your original invoice.

In case of any defect of your phone which prevents you from normal use thereof, you must immediately inform your vendor and present your phone with your proof of purchase.

⁽¹⁾ The warranty period may vary depending on your country.

The life of a rechargeable phone battery in terms of conversation time, standby time and total service life, will depend on the conditions of use and network configuration. Batteries being considered expendable supplies, the specifications state that you should obtain optimal performance for your phone during the first six months after purchase and for approximately 200 more recharges.

If the defect is confirmed, your phone or part thereof will be either replaced or repaired, as appropriate. Repaired phone and accessories are entitled to a one (1) month warranty for the same defect. Repair or replacement may be carried out using reconditioned components offering equivalent functionality.

This warranty covers the cost of parts and labor but excludes any other costs.

This warranty shall not apply to defects to your phone and/or accessory due to (without any limitation):

- Non-compliance with the instructions for use or installation, or with technical and safety standards applicable in the geographical area where your phone is used;
- Connection to any equipment not supplied or not recommended by TCL Communication Ltd.;
- Modification or repair performed by individuals not authorised by TCL Communication Ltd. or its affiliates or your vendor;
- Modification, adjustment or alteration of software or hardware performed by individuals not authorised by TCL Communication Ltd.:
- Inclement weather, lightning, fire, humidity, infiltration of liquids or foods, chemical products, download of files, crash, high voltage, corrosion, oxidation...

Your phone will not be repaired in cases where labels or serial numbers (IMEI) have been removed or altered.

14 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center, here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your device:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the phone's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your phone.
- Update your phone's software via the Updates application. Or you can touch Settings > About phone > Updates to update software.
- Reset your phone via Factory data reset. Touch
 Settings > Backup & reset > Factory data reset >
 RESET PHONE. Another method is to hold down the
 Power key and the Volume up key at the same time
 when your phone is powered off. All your phone data
 will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully
 back up your phone data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

• When the phone can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.

- When the phone falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the **Power** key to reset. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the phone by pressing the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time, selecting a language, and then selecting Wipe data/Factory reset. Press the Volume key to select, and press the Power key to confirm each selection.

My phone has not responded for several minutes

- If your phone doesn't respond, turn off your phone by pressing and holding the **Power** key until it turns off and then restart it again.
- If your phone has a removable battery, remove the battery and reinsert it, then restart the phone.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone.

My phone turns off by itself

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure that the **Power** key is not accidentally pressed while the screen is unlocked.
- Check the battery charge level.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone or update software.

My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the **Alcatel** charger that comes with the phone.
- If your phone has a removable battery, make sure that your battery is inserted properly and clean the battery contact if it's dirty. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.
- Make sure that charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) to 40°C (104°F)).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

- Try connecting to the network by moving to another physical location.
- Verify the network coverage with your operator.
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid.
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- Check your phone's internet connection settings.
- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

Invalid SIM card

- Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted.
- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card is available.

My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialled a valid number and have touched Call.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in aeroplane mode.

My phone can't receive incoming calls

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in aeroplane mode.

The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator.
- Your caller may have concealed his name or number.

I can't find my contacts

- Make sure that your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure that your SIM card is inserted properly.
- Import all contacts stored in SIM card to phone.

The sound quality of the calls is poor

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Volume key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with stronger signal strength.

 Make sure that the receiver, connector and speaker on your phone are clean.

I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require an Alcatel accessory.

When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialled

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.
- Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

I can't add a contact

• Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files to the phone.

My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail

Contact your network operator to check service availability.

I can't access my voicemail

- Make sure that your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

I can't send and receive MMS

Check your phone storage as it might be full.

- Contact your network operator to check service availability and MMS parameters.
- Verify the server centre number or your MMS profile with your operator.
- The server centre may be swamped. Try again later.

SIM card PIN locked

• Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

I can't connect my phone to my computer

- Check to make sure the USB port is not broken. If it's not working, try another USB port on your computer.
- Make sure USB drivers are properly installed.
- If you are using a Windows computer, make sure it supports MTP mode. If you are using a Mac, make sure to install Android File Transfer from www. android.com/filetransfer/.
- Make sure that you're using the correct cable from the box.

I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient phone storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your operator.

The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 150 minutes).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.
- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

The phone becomes warm following prolonged calls, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications

 This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your phone return to normal temperature.

After a factory data reset is performed, I can't use my phone without entering Google account credentials

- After a reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this phone.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as warranty case.

The phone doesn't ring when a call or message arrives

- Make sure that Do Not Disturb mode is not turned on. Go to Settings > Sound > Do Not Disturb.
- Press the **Volume** key to adjust volume.

I forget some passwords/codes/keys on phone

- Perform a factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorised repair centre, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.
